
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## BIBLICAL FRAMEWORK

After developing "A Biblical Framework for Information Literacy", we incorporated biblical mindsets and supporting Scripture into The Researcher's Journey, which:

- **Delineate distinct motivations** Christian student scholars develop as they engage in research and scholarship
- **Promote maturity and growth** in students as they cultivate and practice the dispositions throughout the Research Process

# FACULTY BUY-IN
